## **Procedure for Conducting Election of Lay Delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conferences**

The purpose of this procedure is to improve the process of electing lay delegates to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences while continuing to insure that the opportunity for election is open to any interested individual. Lay delegates will, under this procedure, be better informed about the qualifications of persons who wish to be elected. The balloting and counting will be quicker and the tally of votes will be more accurate.

### Procedural Steps:

1. District Lay Leaders were responsible for explaining to interested individuals the procedure for presenting themselves for possible election. It was also publicized in the *Cross Connection* and on our conference website.
2. All interested individuals were invited to submit photographs of themselves together with brief resumes for inclusion in this booklet to be distributed to all lay delegates to Annual Conference. This booklet has been printed and sent to delegates along with the Pre-Conference Journal mailing. The availability of the resumes and photos of the persons interested in serving as delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conference will enable all lay delegates to Annual Conference to study individual qualifications and vote more intelligently.
3. An explanation of the voting procedure is included in the Pre-Conference Journal mailing as part of the resume booklet.
4. The voting procedure will be as follows:
  - A. Each person listed in the distributed booklet will be assigned a n identifying number which will be shown in the booklet.
  - B. Lay Ballots will be electronic hand-held devices and a personal SIM card to insert into the device. One ballot, or position will be voted on at a time. The identifying numbers of all persons who turned in a resume, will be listed in the Resume Booklets, as well as printed on the front screens to make your selection easier. You will enter the 4-digit number into the hand-held device and press the appropriate key to send your vote into the system.
  - C. Lay persons not in the booklet may also be supported for election so a write-in vote can be made. Those wishing to vote for a write-in will need to submit your name at the appropriate time in the Lay Delegates Meeting on Monday morning to be eligible for selection during voting. We must have all the names of persons wanting to run for a delegate position during the time requested, in order to assign a 4-digit number and have their names appear on the screens during voting.
  - D. Ballots will be tallied by a computer program provided by the IML North America. Please note the following procedures:

- One hand-held device per delegate that will be distributed at the door of each business session. Combined with a SIM card that will be distributed to each delegate at registration.
- Please remove your SIM card when your voting is completed for the day and store in a safe place in your possession. You must have this SIM card to be able to vote. Make sure you take it with you.
- Turn the hand-held device in at the designated tables following the business session. Each device must be turned in each day so that they can be re-charged for the next day. Each device is equipped with an alarm that will sound when the device is taken away from the designated location for voting.
- When all of the ballots through the hand-held devices have been submitted and a delegate is elected, the newly elected delegates name will be added to the list of 2012 Delegates on one of the screens at the front of the General Assembly Hall.
